**To Weed or not to Weed...Collection Development.** Do you have trouble weeding your collection? Do you ask "Should I or shouldn't I get rid of this book"? Do you weed some sections more comfortably than others? **SUNLINK** Weed of the Month website could be the answer. SUNLINK is funded by the Florida Department of Education. On the site choose a Dewey number to learn why you should weed that topic, which Dewey numbers to check, specific criteria for weeding and a list of titles you should discard and new ones to buy!
