On Oct. 17 at 2 p.m., author Kurt Andersen will give a reading and discussion of his new book, "Turn of the Century," a fictional turn of the 20th century novel. "Turn of the Century" is a good old-fashioned novel about the day after tomorrow - an uproarious, exquisitely observed panorama of our world as the 20th

century morphs into the 21st, transforming family, marriage, and friendship propelled by the supercharged global businesses and new technologies that make everyone's lives shake and spin faster.

Andersen is a columnist for The New Yorker. He was co-founder and editor of *Spy* magazine, and

editor in chief of New York magazine. At *Time*, he was an award-winning writer on crime and politics, and for eight years the magazine's architecture and design critic. "Turn of the Century" is his first novel.
