## **Q. Are there any children's programs in the area?**

- A.** The Cairo Public Library offers a series of children's programs including: Babes in Bookland, Toddler Time, and the Summer Reading Program. Call the Library at (518) 622-9864 for additional information. The Town of Cairo offers a Summer Recreation Program. Call the Town Hall at (518) 622-9218 for more information. Other children and teen activities in the area include Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and 4-H.

## **Q. Are there art classes offered in the area?**
