Career Counseling

Our counselors will help you assess your needs, skills and interests. They will guide you through a step-by-step approach to your job search and your re-entry into the workforce.

Resume Development

Expert staff will help you to write and design a resume that gets results. Our SMART program will help match you to job openings. We will show you how to tailor your resume for firms that use resume scanning software and how to market your skills on the Internet.

Adult Basic Education/English as a Second Language
