Immigration:

Data from the U.S. Census Bureau for 2011-2015 indicate that 7,512 people or 4.7% of the population living in this area were "foreign born". Census defines foreign born as anyone who is not a U.S. citizen at birth. This area is located in New York, which, according to the Department of Homeland Security, was home to 141,406 people who were granted Legal Permanent Residence status in 2014. Those LPRs, or "green cards", represent 13.91% of green cards issued in the nation that year.

Tenure:

Across the area, an estimated 65% or 41,240 households owned their home between 2011-2015. The average size of a household in this area was 2.43 between 2011-2015, as compared to the average household size for the county and the state, 2.45 (Washington), 2.43 (Rensselaer), 2.37 (Columbia) and 2.63 (New York) respectively.

Vacancy:

There were an estimated **71,742** housing units in the study area in 2011-2015, according to the Census' American Community Survey. For 2011-2015, the Census showed an estimated **11.56%** of housing units to be vacant, compared to **11.13%** in the state of New York.

Postal vacancy shows short-term vacancy trends based on addresses where mail has not been collected for over 90 days. Data from Valassis Lists tracks vacancy on a quarterly basis. In the 2nd quarter of 2016, the overall vacancy rate in this area was 3.83%.
