Racial Characteristics:

Of the people living in this area in between 2011-2015, 78.5% are White, 10.14% are African American, 11.29% are Hispanic, 3.87% are Asian, 0.03% are either Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, 0.39% are American Indian or Alaskan Native, 4.1% are of "some other race" and 2.97% are of two or more races. In the table below, the percentage of the population that each segment represents in the report area is compared to the percent it represents in the state.

Between 2000 and 2011-2015, the White population changed by -0.41%, the African American population by 17.19%, and Asian population by 61.98%. The number of Hispanics changed by 90.32%.

Incomes:

Immigration:

Data from the U.S. Census Bureau for 2011-2015 indicate that 34,414 people or 11.59% of the population living in this area were "foreign born". Endnotes:

Calculations presented here were performed by staff at PolicyMap and are based on public and proprietary data sources.
