WIRELESS INTERNET POLICY

The Patterson Library offers information resources in many forms, including use of the Internet. We provide access to Wireless Internet (WiFi) so that more patrons may have access to this information through the use of wireless devices. The Patterson Library recognizes that information on the Internet is not governed by any entity and that its available resources may not be accurate, complete, or current. Users are responsible for questioning the validity of the information for their own uses.

The Patterson Library also recognizes that information accessed on the Internet may be controversial and or offensive. Looking at or accessing child pornography, anything harmful to minors is expressly prohibited. Library policy prohibits you from partaking in illegal or malicious actions while using the available network. You are in a public place: if you display text or graphics that may be considered to be offensive to others, you will be asked to stop. If you do not stop, we may ask you to leave the library. Parents and legal guardians have responsibility for their children's use of the Internet, including e-mail, chat rooms, and other forms of electronic communication. The library will not censor what children may/may not see on the Internet. While using WiFi in the Patterson Library, parents must be present and assist children under the age of 10.

Information accessed on Wireless Internet is inherently insecure. We suggest that you do not access sensitive personal information. The library assumes no responsibility for the safety of equipment, or for laptop configurations, security, or data files resulting from connection to the library's network.

Patterson Library is not responsible for any changes made to your computer's settings and cannot guarantee your hardware will work with our wireless connection. The library staff may not assist you with technical advice on any personal computer. You are responsible for setting up your own equipment.

Laptop users must be considerate of patrons nearby and refrain from draping powercords where people may trip or be injured. Please refrain from excessive noise, including the playing of music, without headphones. The library will not be held responsible for laptops left unattended.
